DR. JEONG LECTURES ON HOLOGRAPHY AS ART MEDIUM

Dr. Tung H. Jeong, a leading international authority on Holography, will give a lecture on "Holography as an art medium" on Thursday, June 9 at 7:00 P.M. at Gallery 1134, 1134 West Washington Boulevard, Chicago. Donation is \$2.00.

Dr. Jeong, a physics professor at Lake Forest College and a pioneer in holographic studies, developed the 360 degree single shot transmission hologram in 1965 and made the first integram of a computer generated film in 1973, which was the first continuous integram of a scene greater than 360 degrees.

Artists are just beginning to confront the creative possibilities of the holographic medium, which allows artists for the first time to communicate ideas in totally 3-dimensional visual images that exist in real space and reflect movement.

Dr. Jeong, who is co-sponsoring the international holographic exhibit at Gallery 1134, currently underway until July 3 is showing several holograms at the gallery. These are joined by holograms from the United States, Canada, the Soviet Union and Sweden,
